| Misuse of                       | Personal injury,          | Staff, participants               | Only staff qualified and/or 'signed off' may deliver the activity.  |
| equipment                       | Death                     | and public                        | Staff to control use of equipment and brief on correct use.   |
| Equipment failure               | Personal injury           | Staff, participants and public    | All equipment checked prior to use and taken out of service if not safe. All equipment to meet Archery GB standards. Staff to insure equipment used correctly sized for archer.   |
| Dangerous<br>conduct            | Personal injury           | Staff, participants and public    | Set clear rules during general safety instruction before session begins. Clear briefing by staff of safety rules at the start of the session. Include the instruction not to distract those shooting at any time. Staff to be on shooting line at all times when shooting in progress. Staff to control and supervise equipment when not in use. Only small groups on range (4 shooting) without support/extra staff. |
| Loose hair/<br>jewellery        | Personal injury           | Staff and participants            | Advise participants to remove all jewellery and tie hair back.  |
| Arrow in flight                 | Personal injury,<br>Death | Staff, participants<br>and public | Shoot arrows on command and only from shooting line. Point arrows at target at all times. No deliberate high or wide shooting. All spectators to stay behind safety line. All participants to wait until instructed to collect arrows from the target. Warn non-participating staff that archery is taking place and explain boundaries. Ensure warning signs are in place.   |
| Entry to range                  | Personal injury,<br>death | Staff and participants and public | Signage to be placed on door + door locked from inside. Fire escapes only open outwards. If participants need comfort break ALL SHOOTING MUST STOP until they return to the range and the staff member is satisfied all participants are behind the safety line.  |
| Overshoot                       | Personal injury,          | Staff, participants and public    | Netting in place to protect building and prevent rebounds.  Deliberate missing will result in exclusion from session.   |
| Bow string                      | Personal injury,          | Staff and participants            | Bracers to be used and instruction on correct way to hold bow given.  |
| Arrow knocks protruding targets | Personal injury,          | Staff and participants            | Staff to brief as to correct way to approach target, no open toes shoes to be worn.  No running on range.   |
| Rebounding arrows               | Personal injury,<br>death | Staff and participants            | Minimum of 7m shooting line from target.  |
